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Zion Lutheran School Families,

Good afternoon everyone! I was unable to make it to Classical Education Night because I was ill, but I heard everyone had an enjoyable evening. Thank you PTF, especially Pam Main for providing the baked potato bar. Because I did not get a chance to talk last night about Classical Education, I wanted to write a short letter to our Zion community about what I was planning on sharing about teaching virtue at our school.

Beyond the eternal life of all our students, the cultivation of virtue is our most important goal. Too often we try to do the right thing in the midst of temptation, but it's better to desire, pursue, and enjoy what is the right thing day in and day out. If our students learn to want to obey their parents, they will more easily overcome the temptation to disobey you! If they enjoy giving to the poor that is far better than forcing them to give out of obligation. This is exactly what virtue is: the desire to do good. And having virtue is far more important than having a well-paying job or enjoyable career. Virtue is what creates the peaceful and happy relationships with one another that we all crave. Virtue creates true community.

There are seven virtues that students will be learning this year: Faith, Hope, Charity, Justice, Temperance, Fortitude, and Prudence. The first three, Faith, Hope, and Charity, are virtues that Christians have access to by the power of God living within us. The virtue of Faith is the desire to trust in God. The virtue of Hope is the desire and expectation to live in eternal life with God and all believers. The virtue of Charity is the desire and sacrifice for the benefit of those around us.

These seven virtues are core virtues that are foundational for the good life. The first three are a result of God dwelling inside of us by faith, and the other four are foundational for living the good life. Full of joy, community, lasting contentment. We cultivate these virtues by having our students memorize verses, hymns, and by having them listen to stories of characters who have these virtues. The book that the 5th-7th graders are reading this quarter is Robin Hood. In this novel, the virtues of Charity and Justice are especially highlighted. Robin Hood is a great example to students on how to fight against unlawful tyranny with generosity, love, and justice.

This story is fascinating, but more importantly, it's worthy of imitation. We can seek to sacrifice ourselves for those in need around us even if it means risking a life of comfort. There are many other stories your child's teacher will read together with them in class, all with the goal of cultivating virtue in your child. May God bless ZLS in this pursuit and may He bless your children this school year!

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- <u>Book Fair Postponed</u>: The Book Fair is postponed until the spring. Our plan is for it to be rescheduled around the Literacy program so that students can read their new books during the Literacy program. We found a potential book fair vendor who sends classical books to ensure the books are good content and have stood the test of time.
- **ZLS Spirit Store for SY 2024-2025:** Zion Lutheran School is partnering with Owyhee Graphics this year for our spirit store. They will be opening their online store by the first week of school.
 - The Spirit Store will offer Tee Shirts, Polo Shirts, and Hooded Sweatshirts that will have the option of two different ZLS Logos that will be screen printed or embroidered depending on the type of material.
 - The sizes will be in Youth (XS to XL), Toddler (2T to 4T), Men (XS to 6XL) and Women (XS to 4XL).
 - The colors will be White, Athletic Heather, Ash, Sports Gray, Jet or Jersey Black depending if it's a Tee Shirt, Polo, or Hooded Sweatshirt.
 - The prices for Tee Shirts range from \$13.50 to \$15.50, Polo Shirts range from \$24.18 to \$25.88, and Hooded Sweatshirts range from \$27.00 to \$30.00. *Larger sizes may cost an additional \$1.00 to \$2.00.
 - Currently there will be no discount for bulk orders, but the prices are very competitive.
